Municipal Elections

- In Ontario, Municipal, District Social Services Administration Boards (DSSAB) and School Board elections are held every four years (4th Monday in October)
- Municipal and School Board voting rights in Ontario are tied to a person's relationship to a property
- Persons who are Canadian Citizens, and 18 years of age on voting day are potential electors in every municipality or jurisdiction where they own or occupy property

Roles in the Enumeration and Election Process

There are four main components in Ontario's municipal and school trustee election process.

Each plays an important role.



The Provincial Government establishes legislation to direct the municipal, DASSAB and school board election process.


Information Sources

Information Sources

MPAC makes use of all available data sources to ensure our database is as up-to-date as possible. This includes:

- Regular updates from the National Register of Electors
 - used to confirm unconfirmed citizenship and to add names to properties that are vacant or populated by unconfirmed citizens
- Updates from Elections Ontario and the Permanent Register of Electors (as applicable)
- Updates from Ministry of Government Services on deceased persons
- Ongoing updates of data from MPAC's property assessment system
- Information collected through voterlookup.ca
- Application for Direction of School Support Forms
- Occupancy updates completed by the Customer Contact Centre

DATA Processes







Beyond 2022: What We Know So Far

2022/2023

- MPAC will continue to provide PLEs for any By-Elections to the end of 2023
- MPAC and Elections Ontario will continue to work collaboratively to ensure a smooth transition

(This process has already begun!)

 Responsibility of for PLEs and election related products will shift to Elections Ontario as of January 1

2024

- MPAC will retain responsibility for School Support
- MPAC will continue to support the enumeration process by sharing information with Elections Ontario


Preliminary List of Electors (PLE)

- MPAC is required by legislation to provide the Preliminary List of Electors (PLE) to all municipal clerks
 in an election year or when a by-election occurs
- The PLE is a .pdf that includes each elector's name, school support, residency and occupancy status, property and mailing addresses, and the roll number of the elector's qualifying property
- The PLE is not the Voters' List.
- The PLE is one element of a larger process that allows each municipality to create their final Voters'
 List
- Each municipality is responsible for finalizing their Voters' List.



Voter Notification File (VNF)

- One of the PLE's two companion files
- VNF (Voter Notification File) is an electronic data file equivalent to PLE and is provided in .xml or .xlsx format
- Contains more detailed information about each elector and their qualifying property than found in PLE
- Typically used to populate voter list management applications, and vote-by-mail telephone and internet systems



Voter Notification File - No Electors (VNF-NE)



Serves to provide a property 'placeholder' to receive clerk's revisions (i.e. new elector names)

Population of Electoral Groups (PEG)

- The PEG report must be provided to the Ministry of Education, School Board Election Clerks (i.e. municipal clerks), and Secretaries of each School Board by the 15th of February of an election year (O.Reg 412/00)
- This report may be used to determine the distribution of trustees within each school board jurisdiction and can be used by boards if appealing their allotment of School Board Trustees to the Minister
- It is important to note that the population counted includes all individuals, regardless of voter eligibility, and therefore is not an indication of the number of electors

Municipalities are encouraged to submit ward changes by end of January to ensure they are reflected in the PEG report

Exceptions Files

- Exceptions Voter Notification File (EVNF) and Exceptions Voter Notification File -No Electors (EVNF-NE) / Elector Differences Found Report (EDFR)
- Provided to municipal clerks following the initial Preliminary List of Electors (PLE)/ Voter Notification File (VNF and VNF-NE) delivery and serves to highlight those changes (additions, deletions, changes) that have been processed at MPAC since the original delivery of the PLE/VNF
- Municipal Clerks should use this information to revise the municipal Voters' List to avoid many of the same changes being submitted to MPAC, following the Election as "Voters' List Revisions"

Current Data(September 2022) - PLE & VNF Data = Exceptions Files

Ontario Population Report (OPR)

- Delivered with Exceptions Files
- A .pdf product containing municipal population counts by age, age group, and school support
- Created for planning and other legislative purposes, but not widely used



When Action is Needed

Action Items

- Ward and Poll Changes
- Promotion of VoterLookup now through delivery of the PLE and Exceptions files in 2022
- Product Canvassing
 - Available via Municipal Connect
- Voters List Revisions
 - Municipalities are legislated to provide all Voters' List Revisions to MPAC 30 days following the municipal election or as per the Minister's Directive (Sec. 27(2), Municipal Elections Act, 1996)
 - These changes can be submitted by municipalities using:
 - DataFix Voter View (VV) application (for those municipalities that subscribe)
 - An Excel MPAC-compliant file format
 - Voters' List Revision Forms (EL15) will not be accepted

Wards and Polls

Ward

- A local authority area, typically used for electoral purposes
- Council must pass a bylaw to make changes to Wards

Poll

- A voting subdivision is a geographical area defined to group electors to assist the Clerk in managing the administration of the election
- Municipal Clerks have the authority to make changes to polls

Suffix

- Further optional division of a poll
- Municipal Clerks have the authority to make changes to suffixes

Wards and Polls

- MPAC maintains ward/poll designations on each parcel
- Some municipalities may not have wards or use polls (At-Large)
- Units on same property can have different poll numbers; but all units must have same ward number
- MPAC changes ward/poll assignments based on municipal requests

Process to Revise Ward/Poll Boundaries (PEC)

- The product needed to submit ward/poll changes is called 'Potential Elector Counts Summary Report' (PEC)
- To generate the Potential Elector Counts Summary Report:
 - 1. Login to Municipal Connect
 - 2. Choose 'People Portal' from the menu on the left hand side of the screen
 - 3. From the drop down menu choose 'Potential Elector Counts Summary Report'
 - 4. Click on 'Generate Report'



Recommended Timing for Ward/Poll Boundary Changes

No changes should be made with MPAC until there is no chance of a by-election being required

Ideal for the Municipality to plan to provide changes to MPAC by early January 2022 to ensure ward changes are reflected in the PEG report

Roll numbers do not change as a result of ward/poll boundary changes
