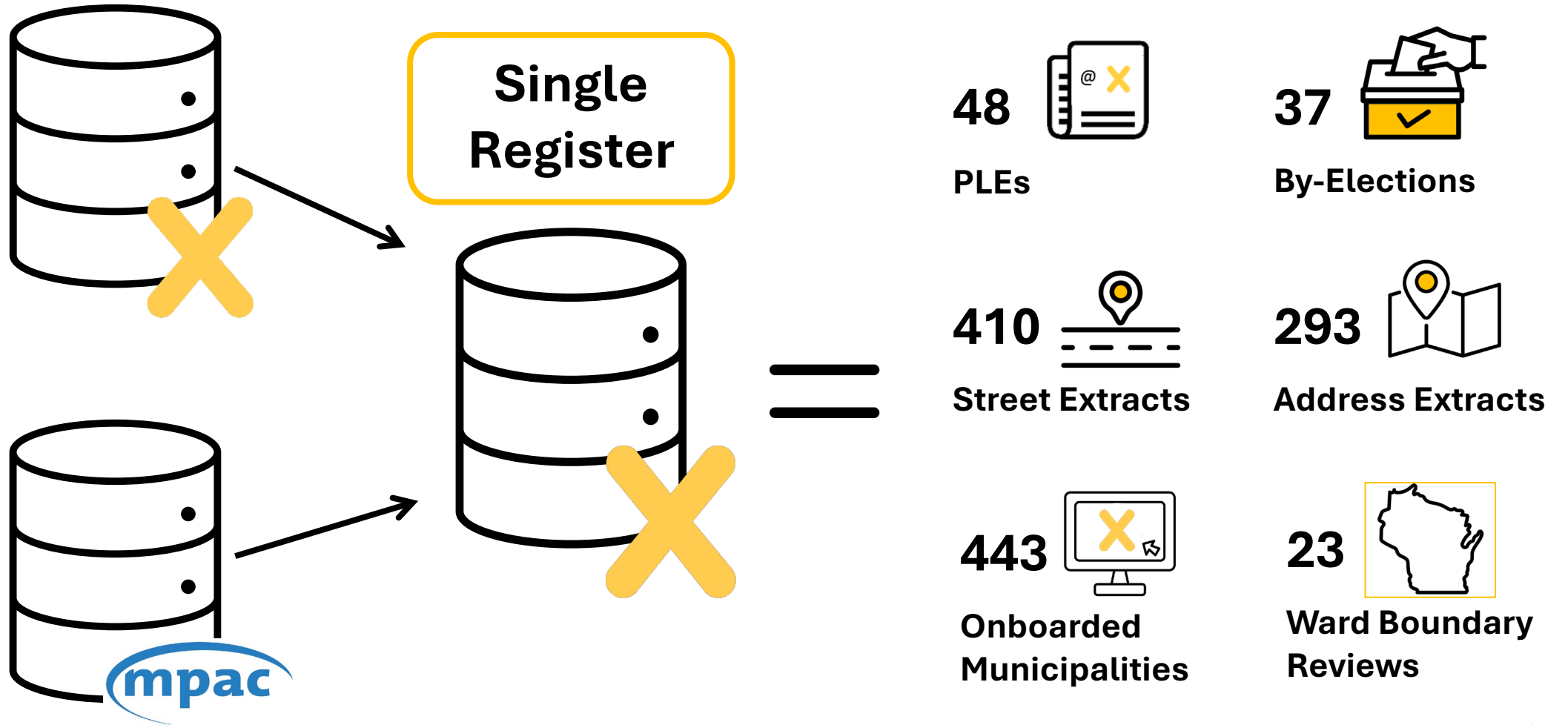

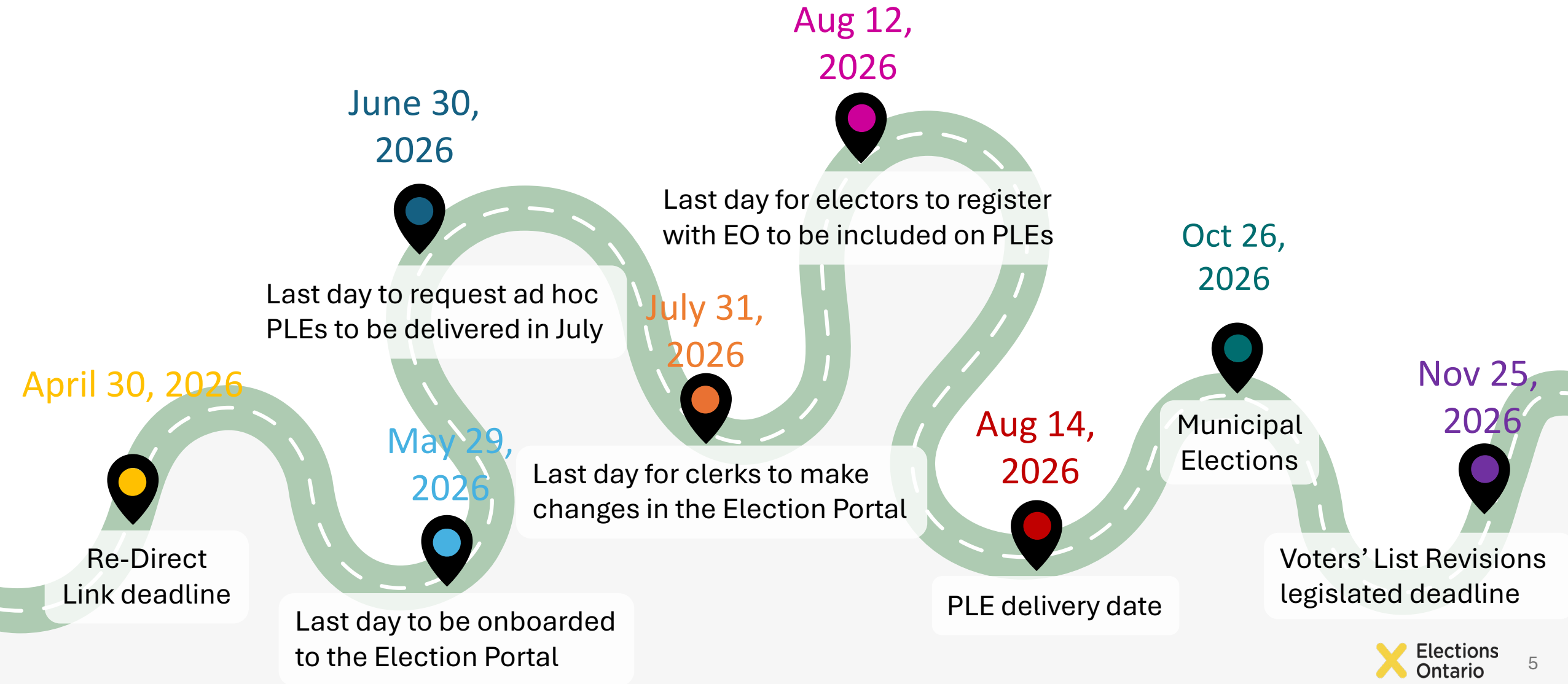

# Leveraging Your Partnership with EO



# Election Portal Update Deadline

---



All requests to update information in the Election Portal must be submitted by **July 31, 2026**.

This will allow Elections Ontario time to review and approve all requested changes so they appear on the PLE.

### It's quick and easy to check your voter information

Are you registered to vote in the 2022 municipal and school board elections on October 24?

If you have moved, changed your name or turned 18 since the 2018 municipal election, you might not be on the voters list.

The municipal voters list is different from provincial and federal lists. So, even if you received a voter's card for the recent federal and provincial elections, it doesn't automatically mean you will be on the municipal voters list, especially if your information has changed. For municipal elections the Municipal Property Assessment Corporation - MPAC is responsible for collecting the information of residents in Ontario, such as name, date of birth, citizenship and school support, in order to create a preliminary list of electors. Municipalities then use that preliminary list of electors to prepare their voters lists.

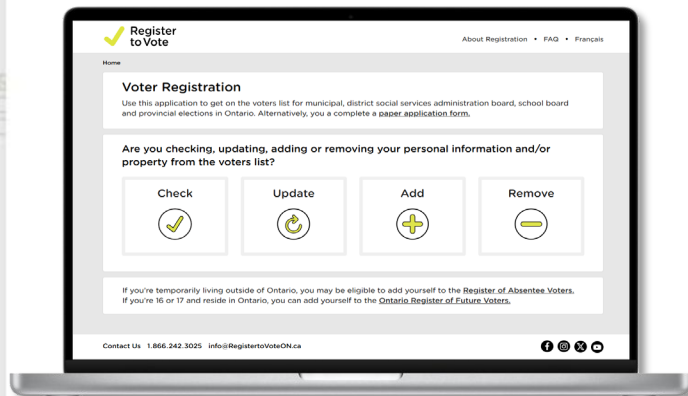





Enhanced layout and structure of Voter Registration website to support display of 444 municipalities:

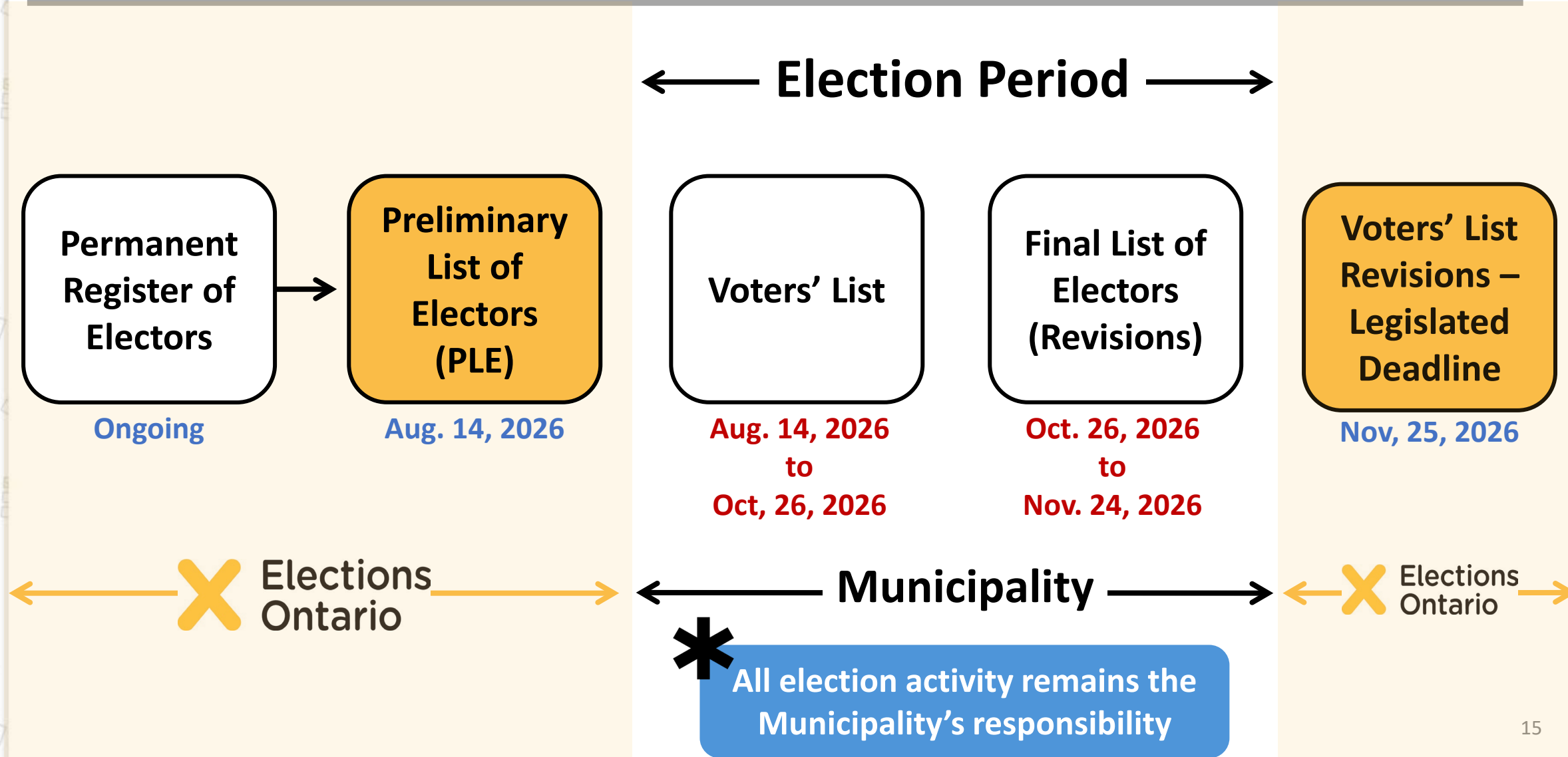

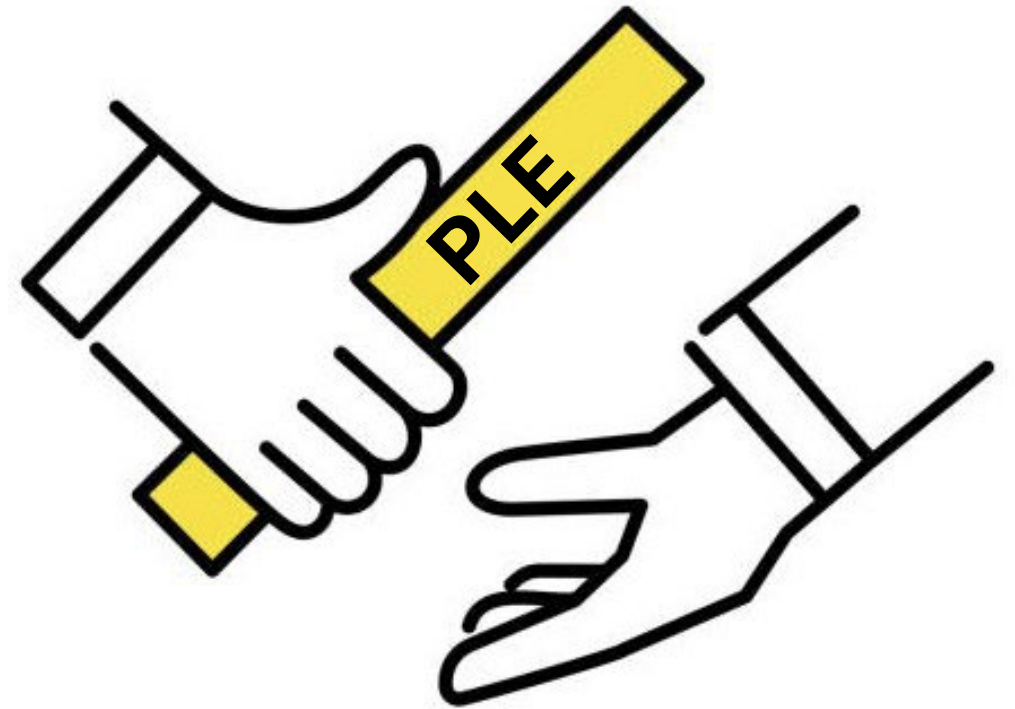


# Your Voters List, Your Election

**All election activity remains the Municipality's responsibility.**

# Final Take Away

## MANDATORY task before PLE provisioning:

1

### Get Onboarded to the Election Portal by May 29<sup>th</sup>

- Confirm you can receive the **two-factor authentication email**
- Confirm you have access to the **Product Vault**
- Confirm you can **view passwords** for products in the Product Vault

### Provide Elections Ontario with your Re-Direct Links by April 30<sup>th</sup>

- Your **municipal elections website link**
- Any **contact information** you want electors referred to

### Inform EO of List Management Method by June 1<sup>st</sup>

- Use of DataFix
- Use of another third-party vendor or internal software
- Use of a paper list or no list management software

# Question

---

**If I make changes in VoterView, will they show up in the Election Portal?**

No. VoterView is a DataFix application and there is no connection between VoterView and EO's Register. Changes made directly in the Election Portal will be reflected on PLEs, changes made on VoterView will not.

# Question

## **When will the Preliminary List of Electors be available for download?**

All PLE's for the 2026 municipal and school board elections will be provisioned on August 14, 2026, and they will be available for download from the Election Portal. Direct transfer of PLEs to DataFix may take longer.

If you require a PLE sooner for election planning purposes, you can request one in the Election Portal.

## **Can I print a copy of the PLE from the Election Portal?**

No. Election Portal products containing personal elector information are only available by request and cannot be printed directly from the Election Portal.

# Question

---

**Can I use the Election Portal for strike-offs during the election period?**

No. The Election Portal is not designed to be used during an election to manage voters' lists or track election strike-offs.

The system is designed to help you with your Election planning only.

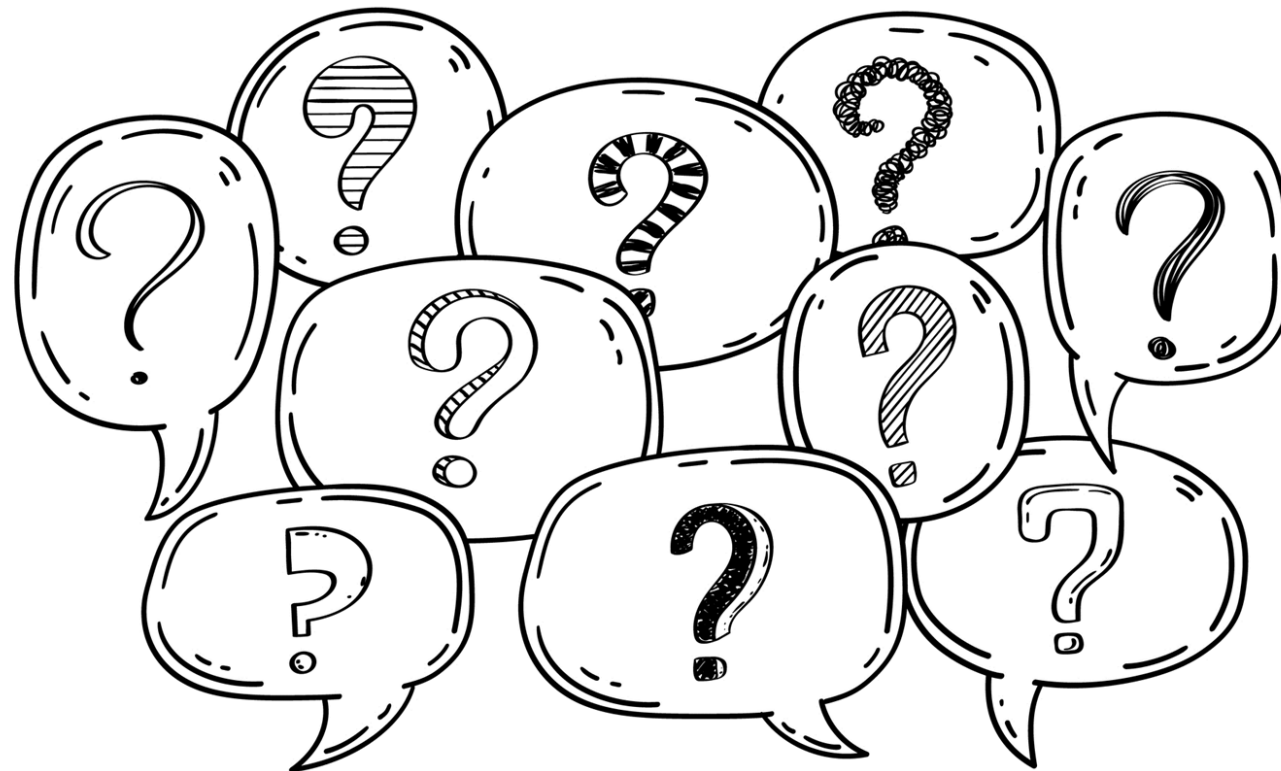
## **Were should I refer my electors to on election day?**
