Roles in the Enumeration and Election Process

There are four main components in Ontario's municipal and school trustee election process.

Each plays an important role.



The Provincial Government establishes legislation to direct the municipal, DASSAB and school board election process.



Corporation (MPAC)
maintains owner and occupancy
information and facilitates
municipal enumeration activities
with the view to delivering the
legislated election products to
municipalities and school boards.

Property Assessment



School Boards
governed by publicly elected
board members (Trustees),
maintain the school board
trustee election process,
determine distribution of
trustees and maintain school
support for respective Board



Municipalities
define ward/poll boundaries
and administer the municipal
and school trustee process.

Beyond 2022: What We Know

2023

- MPAC will continue to provide PLEs for any by-elections to the end of 2023
- MPAC and Elections Ontario will continue to work collaboratively to ensure a smooth transition
 - We are already meeting regularly regarding the transition

2024

- Responsibility for PLEs and election related products will shift to Elections Ontario as of January 1
- MPAC will retain responsibility for collection School Support and Ontario Population Report reporting
- MPAC will continue to support the enumeration process by sharing our 'people data' with Elections Ontario






Enumeration Enquiries in "My Work"


- Enumeration enquiries can now be submitted through the My Work portal of Connect 3.0.



Transforming Municipal Connect

- MPAC originally launched Municipal Connect in 2001 and redesigned the system in 2016.
- In 2020, during the pandemic, MPAC's IT team undertook a complete redevelopment of the system to transform how we share information and support municipalities with the tools they need to manage their assessment base.



Development through partnership

Understanding municipal needs – before making the decision to redevelop Municipal Connect internally, we sought broad engagement with municipal partners to understand their needs and set a vision for the future of Municipal Connect.

Municipal users as development partners – throughout the redevelopment, municipalities have been engaged to ensure their needs are being met.

Leading with user experience – we focused on the user experience to ensure the product met the needs of municipalities. We undertook ongoing engagement and testing with municipal partners through a collaborative working group.



Providing municipalities with the tools they need

Geo-spatial analysis – greater ability for geo-spatial data access and analysis.

Improved search – ability to have more detailed searches and save queries.

Interactive prompts – tools that help prompt users with their use of the platform.

User management – improved ability to manage users.

New dashboards – expanded dashboard and insights, such as Assessment Growth.

Expanded use of MPAC data – ability to use MPAC data to support municipal operations.

Flexible formats – ability to leverage data in flexible formats, such as APIs into municipal systems.

Historic data – ability to see historic data, including retired roll numbers.

Improved interface – an updated user interface with improved user experience.

Municipal data sharing – ability for municipalities to share MPAC data and insights on their websites.

Master Municipal Service Agreement and "Rethinking" the ROLL



Municipal relationships continue to evolve

MPAC wants to simplify our existing agreements by consolidating our existing municipal agreements into a new 'Master Municipal Services Agreement'

The new Agreement will more clearly define the relationship between MPAC and Ontario municipalities.
